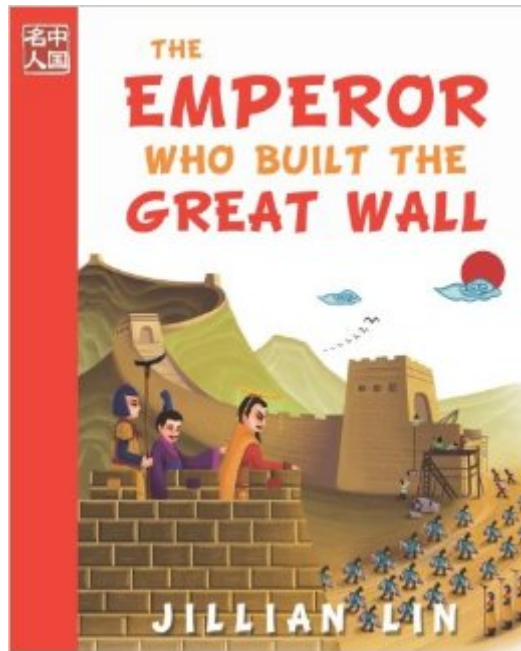

This is a great book about the history of the great wall of china.Covered with great illustration the

Like many others, I have always been fascinated by China and the Great Wall. This book is short and sweet and gives a succinct account of how the wall originally came into being. Plus it explains Qin and the unification of the smaller groups in China. It seems to be a book that my granddaughter will enjoy and that was my main reason for getting it. Nevertheless, I totally enjoyed it also. I would recommend it as a short e-book to anyone interested in either China or the Great Wall.

This would be a great book for reading with your kids as a teaser into the history of China/The Great Wall. There is even a little trivia in the back. The art is nice and there's just enough details that you won't bore older kids but not so much depth that a younger kid would get bored or lose retention.

I think the target audience is a bit off. I liked the history in the book and enjoyed the illustrations but the book I do not think is suited to young children. I am a bit of afraid that some children will take from it that it is ok to hurt and kill to get what you want. I know this is all factual information but it still something I personally would not want my children to read until they were a bit older to understand that this isn't ok. The story tells of how Qin wanted to rule the lands, a attempt was made on his life which resulted in him getting the apprehend and ruling a kingdom by killing those who did not agree with him. He built the wall to protect himself (basically) and dying while looking for the potion for everlasting life. I do not see how this makes kids avoid war.

Would recommend as a good read for children and as quick facts referral. Ancient China was very cruel, like many other countries in barbarian times.
